As outlined by the review panel and further discussed by the committee (where relevant), CTI is recommended to take appropriate action, in so far as it is empowered to do so, on the following issues:

ESG 2.6 Reporting

The agency is recommended to ensure there is more explicit and analytical content in the published reports.

The agency is recommended to improve the visibility of the reports on its website.

The agency is recommended to remove the deliberation tables from the report template - and hence from the draft reports - in order to underline the tables' status as an assessment and consistency tool for the expert panels.
